A Message from Alan Eisenberg, Vice President Federal Government Relations

As a member of the Celgene PAC Board, I am pleased to share Celgene's political contributions report for the first half of 2016, which includes a listing of candidates and political committees supported by the Celgene Corporation Political Action Committee (Celgene PAC) and Celgene Corporation during the period from January 1 through June 30 of 2016.



The Celgene PAC is a volunteer, nonpartisan, employee-run organization that provides opportunities for eligible employees to participate in the American political process. The Celgene PAC supports and contributes to candidates from both political parties who share our commitment to core principles of access and innovation in health care. We believe that expanding access to medicines through a competitive marketplace helps innovation to flourish. Our work at Celgene ensures patient access to innovative and life-saving treatments. The Celgene PAC aids in recognizing the important role biopharmaceutical companies play in the health care system.

During the first half of 2016 the Celgene PAC made contributions totaling \$95,400 to 41 candidates and \$20,000 to nine political committees from both political parties at the federal and state level. Contributions from Celgene Corporation in states where corporate contributions are permitted totaled \$50,800 to 66 candidates from both political parties and \$3,500 to five political committees.

The Celgene PAC continued its strong track record through the first half of 2016 with support to candidates and committees of both parties that share our commitment to discovering, developing, and delivering therapies for patients. This is a strong reflection of the continued support of Celgene PAC members throughout the company.

It is more important than ever for us to positively and proactively engage elected officials to demonstrate the importance of biomedical innovation and patient access in health care. I am confident that together, we can have a positive impact on the environment for innovation and access on behalf of the patients we serve.
